



Lesson 19 – The Meat-Offering

1) What did Daniel Prophecy would happen?

Daniel 9:27 And he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the _____ and the _____ to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate.

Note: An oblation is to present an offering before God

Daniel prophesied that Christ would “**cause the sacrifice and oblation to cease.**” Here the reference is made to the two great divisions of offerings: sacrifices with, and sacrifices without blood.

2) What was the first reference to meat in the Bible?

Genesis 1:29 And God said, Behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding _____; to you it shall be for meat.

There was neither flesh nor blood in the “meat” as meat-offering. The original meaning of the word first used in the Bible is “food”; and in this sense, the term is used in connection with this offering.

3) What did the Meat-Offering entail?

Leviticus 2:1 And when any will offer a meat offering unto the LORD, his offering shall be of fine _____; and he shall pour _____ upon it, and put frankincense thereon:

In some cases, the flour was baked into unleavened cakes, or wafers, before being offered. The bread of the meat-offering was never to be made with leaven. Every meat-offering was seasoned with salt.

4) What else was said about the Meat-Offering?

Leviticus 6:17 It shall not be baked with leaven. I have given it unto them for their portion of my offerings made by _____; it is most holy, as is the sin offering, and as the trespass offering.

No leaven or honey was allowed in any of the meat-offerings; a thing most holy of the offerings of the Lord made with leaven indicated “**malice and wickedness,**” and honey turns sour and leads to fermentation. The qualities of salt are directly opposite. Salt removes and prevents corruption; it is also an emblem of friendship. “**The salt of the covenant**” was never to be omitted from the meat offering, thus reminding God’s people of His protecting care and promise to save, and that only the righteousness of Christ could make the service acceptable to God.



5) What was taken to the brazen altar?

Leviticus 6:15 And he shall take of it his handful, of the flour of the meat offering, and of the oil thereof, and all the frankincense which is upon the meat offering, and shall burn it upon the _____ for a sweet savour, even the memorial of it, unto the LORD.

A portion of the meat-offering was burned on the brazen altar, whether it was flour or unleavened cakes; also, a portion of the oil, and all the frankincense; and the remainder was eaten by the priest in the court.

6) What would happen if a priest offered up a meat-offering?

Leviticus 6:21-22 In a pan it shall be made with oil; and when it is baked, thou shalt bring it in: and the baked pieces of the meat offering shalt thou offer for a sweet savour unto the LORD. And the priest of his sons that is anointed in his stead shall offer it: it is a statute for ever unto the LORD; it shall be wholly _____.

If a priest offered a meat-offering, no portion was eaten, but the entire offering was burned on the brazen altar. The high priest offered a meat-offering every day.

The meat-offering was a very common offering and was united with all burnt-offerings. It was offered every morning and evening on the brazen altar, in connection with the morning and evening burnt-offering. See **Exodus 29:39-42**.

7) What does Leviticus tell us about the meat-offering?

Leviticus 2:14-16 And if thou offer a meat offering of thy firstfruits unto the LORD, thou shalt offer for the meat offering of thy firstfruits green ears of _____ dried by the fire, even corn beaten out of full ears. And thou shalt put oil upon it, and lay frankincense thereon: it is a meat offering. And the priest shall burn the memorial of it, part of the beaten corn thereof, and part of the oil thereof, with all the frankincense thereof: it is an offering made by fire unto the LORD.

Note: here is something noteworthy, corn as we know it wasn't heard of in the old world until the 16th Century. No doubt they had when the King James Version was translated in 1611. Corn here would mean grain, barley, wheat, spelt, etc...

What an affecting picture of the Man of Sorrow! How like the very life! The best ears of the finest corn (grain) in the plains of Israel are plucked while yet green; and instead of being left to ripen in the cool breeze, and under a genial sun, are withered up by the scorching fire. It was thus that the only pure humanity that ever walked on the plains of the earth was wasted away during three-and-thirty years by the heat of wrath He had never deserved. While obeying night and day, with all His soul and strength, the burning wrath of God was drying up His frame. 'Beaten out of full ears,' represents the bruises and strokes whereby He was prepared for the altar. Though He were a Son, yet learned He obedience by the things which He suffered. It is after this preparation that He is a perfect meat offering, fully devoted, body and substance, to the Lord.



8) What was Jesus for us?

1 Corinthians 15:20 But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the _____

In all this, He is **"First-fruits,"** intimating that many more shall follow. He the first-fruits, then all that are His in like manner. We must be conformed to Jesus in all things; and here it is taught us that we must be conformed to Him in self-dedication, self-renunciation. We must please the Father; as He left us an example, saying, **"I do always those things that please Him."** **John 8:29**

The meat-offering typified the full surrender of all we have, and all we are, to the Lord. This offering was always presented along with some animal sacrifice, thus showing the connection between pardon of sin and consecration to the Lord. It is after an individual's sins are forgiven that he lays all upon the altar to be consumed in God's service.

9) What did Peter tell us?

1Peter2:9 But ye are a chosen generation, a royal _____, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light:

Imagine if you will, Jesus celebrating the Passover with His disciples **Mathew 26:26 And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, Take, eat; this is my body.** We are the priesthood of believers partaking of the meat-offering in a Holy place when we observe the communion service.
