



Lesson 46 – The Law Repeated

based on Deuteronomy 4 to 6:28

The Lord announced to Moses that the appointed time for the possession of Canaan was at hand; and as the aged prophet stood upon the heights overlooking the river Jordan and the Promised Land, he gazed with deep interest upon the inheritance of his people.

1) What did Moses ask of God?

Deuteronomy 3:24-25 O Lord GOD, thou hast begun to shew thy servant thy greatness, and thy mighty hand: for what God is there in heaven or in earth, that can do according to thy _____, and according to thy might? I pray thee, let me go over, and _____ the good land that is beyond Jordan, that goodly mountain, and Lebanon.

2) God replied:

Deuteronomy 3:26-27 ... Let it suffice thee; speak _____ unto me of this matter. Get thee up into the top of Pisgah, and lift up thine eyes westward, and northward, and southward, and eastward, and behold it with thine eyes: for thou shalt _____ go over this Jordan.

Without a murmur Moses submitted to the decree of God. And now his great anxiety was for Israel. Who would feel the interest for their welfare that he had felt?

3) What did Moses pray?

Numbers 27:16-17 Let the LORD, the God of the spirits of all flesh, set a man over the congregation, Which may go out before them, and which may go in before them, and which may lead them out, and which may bring them in; that the _____ of the LORD be not as sheep which have no _____.

4) Whom did God pick?

Numbers 27:18-20 And the LORD said unto Moses, Take thee _____ the son of Nun, a man in whom is the spirit, and lay thine hand upon him; And set him before Eleazar the priest, and before all the congregation; and give him a _____ in their sight. And thou shalt put some of thine _____ upon him, that all the congregation of the children of Israel may be obedient.

Joshua had long attended Moses; and being a man of wisdom, ability, and faith, he was chosen to succeed him.

5) What was Joshua's calling?

Numbers 27:21-22 And he shall stand before Eleazar the priest, who shall ask counsel for him after the judgment of Urim before the LORD: at his _____ shall they go out, and at his word they shall come in, both he, and all the children of Israel with him, even all the congregation. And Moses did as the LORD commanded him: and he took Joshua, and set him before Eleazar the priest, and before all the _____:

Through the laying on of hands by Moses, accompanied by a most impressive charge, Joshua was solemnly set apart as the leader of Israel. He was also admitted to a present share in the government.



- 6) What final encouragements did Moses give to the people in his last address?

Deuteronomy 4:1-2 Now therefore _____, O Israel, unto the statutes and unto the judgments, which I teach you, for to do them, that ye may live, and go in and possess the land which the LORD God of your fathers giveth you. Ye shall not add unto the word which I command you, neither shall ye diminish _____ from it, that ye may keep the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you.

Deuteronomy 4:23 Take heed unto yourselves, lest ye _____ the covenant of the LORD your God, which he made with you, and make you a graven image, or the likeness of any thing, which the LORD thy God hath forbidden thee.

Deuteronomy 4:30 When thou art in tribulation, and all these things are come upon thee, even in the latter days, if thou turn to the LORD thy God, and shalt be _____ unto his voice;

Deuteronomy 4:36 Out of heaven he made thee to hear his voice, that he might _____ thee: and upon earth he shewed thee his great fire; and thou heardest his words out of the midst of the fire.

Deuteronomy 7:9 Know therefore that the LORD thy God, he is God, the _____ God, which keepeth covenant and mercy with them that love him and keep his commandments to a thousand generations;

Moses faithfully set before them their errors and the transgressions of their fathers. They had often felt impatient and rebellious because of their long wandering in the wilderness; but the Lord had not been chargeable with this delay in possessing Canaan; He was more grieved than they because He could not bring them into immediate possession of the Promised Land and thus display before all nations His mighty power in the deliverance of His people. With their distrust of God, with their pride and unbelief, they had not been prepared to enter Canaan.

- 7) What did he remind them?

Deuteronomy 6:10-12 And it shall be, when the LORD thy God shall have brought thee into the land which he swore unto thy fathers, to _____, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give thee great and goodly cities, which thou buildedst _____, And houses full of all good things, which thou filledst not, and wells digged, which thou diggedst not, vineyards and olive trees, which thou plantedst not; when thou shalt have eaten and be full; Then _____ lest thou forget the LORD, which brought thee forth out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage.

- 8) What blessing did Moses pronounce to the congregation?

Deuteronomy 28:1-3 And it shall come to pass, if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice of the LORD thy God, to _____ and to do all his commandments which I command thee this day, that the LORD thy God will set thee on high _____ all nations of the earth: And all these blessings shall come on thee, and overtake thee, if thou shalt hearken unto the voice of the LORD thy God. _____ shalt thou be in the city, and blessed shalt thou be in the field...

- 9) What would happen if they didn't hearken unto God?

Deuteronomy 28:15-16 But it shall come to pass, if thou wilt _____ hearken unto the voice of the LORD thy God, to observe to do all his commandments and his statutes which I command thee this day; that all these _____ shall come upon thee, and overtake thee: Cursed shalt thou be in the city, and cursed shalt thou be in the field...



10) What did Moses predict for Israel?

Deuteronomy 28:49 The LORD shall bring a nation _____ thee from far, from the end of the earth, as swift as the eagle flieth; a nation whose tongue thou shalt not understand;

By the Spirit of Inspiration, looking far down the ages, Moses pictured the terrible scenes of Israel's final overthrow as a nation, and the destruction of Jerusalem by the armies of Rome

11) What did Moses predict?

Deuteronomy 28:52 And he shall _____ thee in all thy gates, until thy high and fenced walls come down, wherein thou trustedst, throughout all thy land: and he shall besiege thee in all thy gates throughout all thy _____, which the LORD thy God hath given thee.

12) What challenge did he leave them with?

Deuteronomy 30:19 I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you _____ and _____, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live:

Deuteronomy 30:20 That thou mayest _____ the LORD thy God, and that thou mayest obey his voice, and that thou mayest _____ unto him: for he is thy life, and the length of thy days: that thou mayest dwell in the land which the LORD sware unto thy fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give them.

13) And what about the future generations?

Deuteronomy 6:6-7 And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: And thou shalt _____ them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou _____ by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.

14) When children ask, "What mean these things?" how should we respond?

Deuteronomy 6:24-25 And the LORD commanded us to do all these statutes, to _____ the LORD our God, for our good always, that he might _____ us alive, as it is at this day. And it shall be our righteousness, if we observe to do all these commandments before the LORD our God, as he hath commanded us.
